Collection Description

Historical and Biographical Information

Manzer Belanger Sr. was born on July 4, 1906 in what is known today as the town of Wallagrass, Maine. He married Pauline Paradis Belanger on November 5, 1929 at the St. Louis Catholic Church in the neighboring town of Fort Kent. The couple lived in Belanger Settlement, now known as St. Antoine Road, Wallagrass, until they relocated to Fort Kent in the 1940s. The couple had fifteen children together. Manzer passed away on March 29, 1984.

Scope and Content

1 C-120 minute audio cassette containing an interview with Manzer Belanger, Sr. regarding growing up in “Belanger Settlement” or “Liche Lard” (Wallagrass, Maine), with songs by Oscar Pelletier.

One 2 ½’ map of Belanger Settlement showing farms, buildings, and names of residents.
