Organizational history:

Fort Kent, Maine's, first Catholic church was built in 1860. On October 1, 1875, the town's St. Louis Parish received its first resident pastor. A larger church was built in 1882, but destroyed by a fire on March 30, 1907. A chapel was built in its place in 1907, while the present structure was built between 1909 and 1911.
