Biographical/historical data:

"U.S. 1: American Profile [Maine excerpt]" is an excerpt from the 60-minute television documentary special "U.S. 1: American Profile." This program about the 2,500-mile highway which runs from Fort Kent, Maine to Key West, Florida was produced for NBC-TV in 1962 with sponsorship from the Savings & Loan Foundation. Narrated by actor Van Heflin, the documentary was produced and written by Lou Hazam and directed by Tom Priestley and Ray Garner. Camera crews were directed by Tom Preistley in the north and Ray Carver in the south. The program was broadcast on NBC 29 March 1962."

Provenance: NBC News Archives produced this videocassette excerpt in 1995 as a courtesy to the Acadian Archives. Archives director Lisa Ornstein had established contact with NBC seeking permission to make a videocassette transfer of a 30-minute 16 mm. film excerpt of "U. S. 1: American Profile" donated to the Archives as part of the Fort Kent Historical Society Collection. NBC News Archives staff informed her that NBC owns the copyright and that the Acadian Archives did not have the right to make such a transfer. They also informed her that the 60-minute film was not available through a commercial distributor. However, their News Archives offered to donate a transfer the "Maine segment" of the documentary to the Archives.
