Collection Description

Historical and Biographical Information

Robert Conners was born in Pictou County, Nova Scotia on December 18, 1829. He moved to Upper Saint Francois, Madawaska County, New Brunswick as a youth and began his varied business career there.

In the community, which was renamed "Connors" in his honor, he established a general store. The railway store served as a railway depot at the end of the branch line of the Temiscouata Railway. His other facilities for the railway included lodging houses for the builders and work crews. Robert Conners was also a lumber merchant, caring on business with such companies as the Saint John firm of Murray & Gregory. He also built a church for the use of all denominations in the community.

Robert Conners died on March 9, 1895 in Hot Springs, Arkansas, USA.

Scope and Content

The Robert Conners Merchant Records Ledger spans the years 1875-1923 and transactions were handwritten as they took place in the general store at the time. All transactions were written in English asn items sold at the store consist of kitchenware, hardware, clothing, footwear, groceries, tobacco products, grains, logs, lumber, etc. These documents shed light on how and what transactions were done in years past.
