Maxime Albert was born in St. Agatha on April 15, 1901 and died July 12, 1991. He was married to Julia (Gauvin) Albert and had three sons: George Roland and Fernand; and three daughters: Marie, Cecile and Lorraine. Maxime was a potato farmer who took over his father's farm on Long Lake in St. Agatha, Maine at the age of sixteen, following his father's death. Five generations of Alberts have lived and worked "Albert's Farm" on Long Lake.
