<u>Provenance, scope and Content Notes,</u> The eighty slides in the "Paula Lerner Photographs, 1995" collection are a representative selection of a series of approximately 400 images of Maine's Upper St. John Valley shot during the summer and early fall of 1995 by Paula Lerner. Ms. Lerner, a professional free-lance photographer, took these photographs for Mark Sullivan's *Yankee Magazine* features "This New England," which appeared in the June 1996 issue. The original images belong to the photographer. Acadian Archives staff contacted Ms. Lerner and requested that she select a representative sampling of the slides for purchase by the Archives.

The majority of Ms. Lerner's photographs document the potato harvest at the J. A. & R. Farm (St. Francis), the 1995 Acadian Festival (Madawaska), and the Chassè Family Reunion (Madawaska and St. Agatha). There are also a small number of photographs of individuals, the international border, and exteriors of private homes.

In addition to the microfilms, this collection includes a copy of the June 1996 *Yankee Magazine* in which Ms. Lerner's photographs of the St. John Valley first appeared.

<u>Biographical Note.</u> Paula Lerner, born in New York City in 1959, is a free-lance photographer based in the Boston area who works primarily for national and international magazines. Her clients include *The New York Times*, The National Geographic Society, *Smithsonian Magazine, Time, Newsweek, German GEO, Der Spiegel* (Germany), *Panorama* (Italy), *and AERA* (Japan). She was a1993 Pictures of the Year Award Winner and a multiple medal winner in the 1996 Big Picture Awards.

Order and Arrangement. The Photographer's original order has been maintained.

<u>The Inventory</u>. The inventory consists of the photographer's captions, which have been transcribed verbatim.

<u>Indexes.</u> At the end of the inventories, Archives staff has prepared indexes of personal names, subjects, sites, and towns. The personal name index, which is based on information supplied by the photographer, is not complete. Archives staff will be happy to add names of individuals identified by users of this collection.

<u>Related Publication.</u> A number of the photographs in this collection were published in the June 1996 issue of *Yankee Magazine* to accompany Mark Sullivan's article "This New England" (pp. 38-51, 118-121).
