Organizational history:

Fraser Paper began as the Edmundston Pulp Mill in 1918. Prior to this, Archibald Fraser, the company's founder, focused on the lumber industry; it was with the 1918 mill that he moved from lumber to pulp. In 1921 the international bridge was built, linking Edmundston, New Brunswick, to Madawaska, Maine. Four years later, in 1925, the Fraser paper mill was completed.
