## Biographical information:

George Sproule (1741-1817) was New Brunswick, Canada's first surveyor general; he served from 1784 until his death in 1817.

## Scope and content:

This collection consists of four slides depicting a 1787 map titled "A Survey from the Great Falls of the River St. John to the head of Lake Tamasquatat with part of the portage leading from that lake to the River St. Lawrence. Taken in July and August 1787 by George Sproule Esqr. Surveyor General of New Brunswick by order of His Excellency Lieut. Governor Carleton." Also included is a survey of the continuation of the portage to the St. Lawrence by Mr. Collins, Deputy Surveyor of the Province of Quebec.

The original map is in color, but the slides were filmed in black and white.
