*Scope and Content Note.*

This map shows the region of St. Agatha, Maine known locally as “Montagne Plate” (Flat Mountain). Flat Mountain Road is the main artery of this “back settlement” region which formerly was one of the most densely populated areas of the town. The eastern terminus of Flat Mountain Road is located off the Rte. 162 less than a mile from Long Lake. The map of “Familles de la Montagne Plate” shows the homes and lists the owners of properties, past and present, in the region. It was created as part of activities and events celebrating the centennial of the Town of St. Agatha, Maine, in 1999.
