**Description**: 11 audio cassette tapes of Baptist Minister Philip Calvin Hughey's recorded sermons in 1969 and 1970 while living in New Milford, Connecticut.

*Provenance:* The audio cassettes were recorded in New Milford, Connecticut by Minister Philip Calvin Hughey in 1969 and 1970 and they were brought to the Acadian Archives/Archives acadiennes by Darrell McBreairty. The "archival donation form" could not be found on this collection so Archives' Director had Mr. McBreairty sign another form on 7 March 2008.

**Physical Description:** 11 audio cassettes. The cassettes were in reasonable condition for their age, although the original audio quality is fair to poor. One cassette with title, "12/28/69 Vanished", had a broken magnetic strip and had to be repaired by Archives' staff in order to be played and transferred on an archival gold CD.

On one other audio cassette with titles "Second Coming and Secret of Increase" the magnetic tape was broken and both ends were completely inside the container and had to be mended before playing. With the help of our audio visual staff the magnetic tape had to be transferred to another holding container in order for the audio to be played and transferred to an archival gold CD.

"Talk with Gram" sound quality on this cassette is poor.

Several labels were loose, although still associated with their cassettes.

#### **Scope and Content Note**

The audio recordings in this collection were made by Philip Calvin Hughey, a Baptist Minister serving the Allagash region from 1960 to 1968. Although the recordings are a collection of sermons made by Mr. Hughey when he was living in New Milford, Connecticut in 1969 and 1970. All the sermons are in English and the label data and content refer to passages of the Bible.

There is a total of 11 audio cassettes in the original collection. All sides were recorded.

The overall sound quality is "good to poor". All the cassettes are devoted primarily to Mr. Hughey's sermons, except for one audio cassette titled "Talk with Gram".

**Biographical Note**: Philip Calvin Hughey was born in Portland, Maine on July 12, 1901, the son of Fred and Ella Hughey. He made his appearance in Allagash, Maine with his

first wife, Grace Walsh, around the 1920s. After his first wife's death, he married Margaret McBreairty, Darrell's grandmother, on August 14, 1957. Mr. Hughey attended Nyack Bible College in New York and studied at Gordon College in Boston.

He was ordained into the Baptist ministry on May 22, 1922. He was pastor at Lisbon Falls, Maine from 1924 to 1926; at Boothbay, Maine from 1926 to 1928; at Rockport, Maine, from 1928 to 1930; at Ruggles Street Baptist Church in Boston, Massachusetts from October 1930 to May 1936; at the Wadsworth Baptist Church in New York City from May 1936 to February 1945. In February 1945 he came to Aroostook County, Maine to minister and preached at the United Baptist Church in Presque Isle until October 1955. It was while in the county that Mr. Hughey started building the Aroostook Bible Camp in Allagash, Maine. From February 1958 to October 1960, Mr. Hughey ministered at the Conservative Baptist Church in Limestone, Maine, where he also helped design and build the church. He was the Baptist Minister in Allagash, Maine from 1960 to 1968 and then moved to New Milford, Connecticut from October 1968 until his retirement in 1970 when he and his wife Margaret came to live in Allagash.

Philip Calvin Hughey died in Fort Kent, Maine on February 27, 1993 and was buried in the Allagash Baptist Cemetery. Darrell McBreairty mentions in his essay that "his tombstone is about the only physical reminder that he once held an important position in this small community, but his deep religious convictions and his compassion will stay with us for generations."
