Biographical information/Company history: The Aroostook Oral History Project was conducted in 1972 and funded by a Title I, LSCA Grant a community-based oral history collecting project in 1972. The project was headed by Professor Charlotte Lenentine Melvin of Ricker College, in Houlton, Maine. and was sponsored by the Cary Library in Houlton.

Scope and content:

This collection consists of the oral histories of more than 150 people, totaling 73 hours, "covering a wide range of topics, including early county history, early farming and machinery, the Aroostook War, railroading, lumbering, potato farming, maple sugar making, folksongs, folklore, folk medicine, politics, town meetings, cross-border migration, smuggling, Native Americans, sporting camps, schools and schooling, tall tales, superstitions, and many other aspects of the county's cultural heritage" (Maine Folklife Center). The interviewers for each community appear to have been local volunteers and there is considerable variation in content, format, and quality between different communities and individual recordings. Interviews are mostly in English, but there are a number of interviews in French (or a mixture of French and English) and in Swedish.

The recordings appear to have been reproduced by acoustic copying (playing one recorder while recording on another), and many appear to be several generations from the originals. As a result, it often is unclear which voices belong to the interviewer and interviewees and which belong to subsequent handlers. Many tapes contain fragments from more than one interview and/or informant.

The collection also includes an index, which contains a description of the project, a guide to the numbering systems used, a general index, and a content listing.
