Biographical information:

Manzer Bélanger was born on July 4, 1906, in Wallagrass, Maine, to François Xavier Bélanger and Philomène Gagnon. He married Pauline Paradis; they raised 15 children and one adopted grandchild. Manzer worked at the hospital, Daigle Starch, and other potato farms. Pauline worked as a homemaker and in the high school cafeteria. Manzer died on March 29, 1984.

Scope and content:

This collection consists of Manzer Bélanger's certificate on the Catholic sacraments of baptism, first communion, and confirmation at St. Joseph's Church (the location of the church is not noted). According to the certificate, Belanger was baptized on July 4, 1906; he made his first communion in the church on June 11, 1916; he was confirmed on July 1, 1917. The certificate has an elaborate color engraving depicting the sacraments. The certificate is in French.
