Organizational history:

Aroostook County was incorporated on March 16, 1839. It is Maine's northernmost county and is bordered to the east, west, and north by Canada.

Description: This tiny original 8 in. x 11 in. map was salvaged from a large State of Maine wall map dated 1862. It shows homes, buildings and businesses as little blocks. It is cloth backed. It has surface wear and some stains.

Scope and content:

This collection consists of a portion of a map of the state of Maine, dated 1862. The map contains field work performed by L.H. Eaton of Bangor under the direction of H.F. Walling Map Establishment of New York. The portion depicts Northern Maine, including the towns of Fort Kent, Wallagrass, Eagle Lake, Daigle Plantation, Dionne Plantation, Madawaska, Grand Isle, Van Buren, Hamlin, Limestone, Forestville, and Woodland Plantation. Some businesses and homes are noted on the map.
