**Organizational history:**

The Fort Kent Block House was erected during the "Bloodless" Aroostook War of 1838-1839, resulting from a border dispute between Great Britain and the United States. It remained occupied by troops until 1845.

Hotel Dickey was located in Fort Kent, Maine. It served a large number of travelers in Northern Maine, and provided 31 rooms, nine of which were "outside." The hotel burned down in 1928.

***Scope and content:***

This collection consists of a postcard from Hotel Dickey depicting the Fort Kent Block House. The postcard is blank and undated.
