Florence Rose Martin was born in Saint Agatha, Maine in 1938 to O'Neil E. Martin (1912-1967) and Albertine Chasse (b. 1920). She moved to Lewiston, Maine in 1956, where she has lived ever since. Darlene Rose Kritzman is Florence's daughter.

***Scope and content:***

This collection consists of an audio recording of an interview with Florence Martin and Darlene Rose Kritzman by Keith Ludden on April 13, 2004. In the interview, Florence speaks about growing up in Fort Kent, Maine, Acadian music, her memories growing up in the area and of her family, and the language of the Acadian region of the Saint John Valley.
