Biographical information:

Adele Ouellette Plourde (1880-1904) was born to Auguste Ouellette and Desneiges Dionne. Auguste passed away in 1883, and Desneiges married his brother, Hilaire Cstonguay (himself a widower) in 1885. Adele worked as a teacher. She married Augustin James Plourde on July 22, 1900 in St. Luce church in Frenchville, Maine. They raised three children: Hally, Alphie, and Esie. Adele passed away on March 13, 1904, two weeks after giving birth to Elsie. She is buried in the St. Agatha cemetery.

Scope and content:

This collection consists of a photocopy of Adele Plourde's diary, beginning in 1897 when she was a teacher for the Grant School. Additional entries were made after Adele's death by her mother and daughter, Elsie. Also included in the collection are scanned images of Adele's gravestone and of those belonging to her relatives; correlations of Adele's students with census data, researched by Carroll Deschaines; annotations by Carroll on Adele's personal journal entries; and a photocopy of a map (Roe and Colby) showing the location of the school where Adele taught.
