Biographical information:

Aurelle Collin was born in St. Agatha, Maine on June 23, 1920, the son of Medley and Ozithe Chasse Collin. He lived in Lille, Maine for more than 80 years. Collin served in World War II in the U.S. Army, Battalion B33. After his return to Lille, he ran his parents' potato farm until his retirement. Collin then began to work as a wood carver,

becoming well-known as an Acadian folk artist, primarily for his wooden miniatures of horse-drawn wagons and sleds. He married Bernadette Morin of Lille in circa 1951. Collin passed away on September 10, 2004.

Scope and content:

This collection consists of two recordings of interviews with Aurelle Collin, conducted by Don Cyr at the National Folk Festival in Bangor, Maine, August 23-24, 2003. In the interviews, Collin speaks about his life in the Saint John Valley.
