Biographical information:

Gary Pelletier was born in 1942 and is one of 5 children born to Leonard J. and Mary Dufour Pelletier of St. Francis. He was brought up in the St. Pamphile area and attended the St. Agatha Convent for a couple of years. His family moved to the Allagash area and he attended schools in Allagash and St. Francis. Gary married Linda and they have 4 sons and 1 daughter. Mr. Pelletier was a scaler for International Paper and he also followed in his father's footsteps, his uncle Maynard's footsteps to become a game warden in 1966. Mr. Pelletier retired in 1996 from the Game and Wildlife Department but he is still an avid collector and historian concerning the law enforcement branch.

Scope and content:

This collection consists of photographs from an unidentified photograph album discovered by Gary Pelletier in a garbage can on Cross Lake in Maine. Some of the photographs have been identified by archives staff and Mr. Pelletier. Included are images of Square Lake, Maine; Fort Kent, Maine; logging camps; Curless Hotel in Grand Falls, New Brunswick; Grand Falls, New Brunswick; Fraser Camps on Square Lake; Saint John Valley; logging camps in Aberdeen, Washington; and Cross Lake in Maine. The images depict people, places, animals, and events.

Inventory:

Volume 1: Photograph album.

Processing action: Photocopies of the original photographs were produced and placed in polypropylene sleeves for preservation and inserted in one album with shelf list number UP-317. Several weeks later, after the copies of the photographs were made, Mr. Pelletier donated the original photos. The original were inserted in their own polypropylene sleeves with the corresponding copies following in the same album. The copies were given a number. Some photos were identified by Mr. Pelletier.
