Biographical information: Researcher, historian, genealogist and author, Dubay has done extensive research on the French colonisation of the Upper Saint John River Valley (both sides of the river) from the Lower Saint Lawrence (Québec) and Acadia . Dubay has also been a Guest Lecturer at the University of Maine at Fort Kent and is a strong supporter of the French culture and language in Aroostook county Maine . Scope and content:

This collection consists of correspondence, research materials, and writings by Guy Dubay. The subjects focus on the people, culture, and history of the Saint John River Valley in Maine and New Brunswick. Included are materials on John Baker, the town of Madawaska, the Aroostook delegation of 1840-1992, Acadians, Blackie Cyr, Captain Joseph Harney Thibodeau, Cyrus S. Clark, genealogies, Grand Isle, and Representative Emilien Levesque." The collection contains various chronologies and resource lists for subjects such as regional history, the Northeastern boundary dispute, prohibition, and state senate candidates from the St. John Valley.
