Henry Long was born on August 27, 1909, and died on November 26, 1993.

Scope and content:

This collection consists of oral histories conducted by Joel Long with members of the Long and Chaisson families. Included are interviews with Arthur Chaisson, Melanie Chaisson, Mrs. Theodore Chaisson, Albert Long, Antonio Long, Cecile Long, Henry Long, Marguerite Long, Mary Long, and Romeo V. Long, all conducted in French. Marguerite and Henry Long discuss family life, education, religion, and humor. Henry Long also plays the violin and Marguerite Long sings during the interview. Albert Long of Clair discusses family, education, work, and myths. He also tells the legend of the Lang family. Mary Long's interview includes an unidentified man reading a composition she wrote, "Of a Wedding Anniversary" and discussion of her life experiences. Romeo Long and his wife, Cecile, discuss life and family experiences. Antonio Long of Clair discusses his life experiences, logging, myths, and legends.

Melanie Chaisson discusses her life and family experiences, as well as people who have died. Arthur Chaisson discusses life experiences. Mrs. Theodore Chaisson discusses life during the 1920s.
