Biographical information:

Octave F. Caron (1914-1983) was born in St. Anne, New Brunswick on August 10, the son of Octave and Estaire Raymond Caron, Sr. He was a World War II veteran and a member of the Madawaska American Legion, Thomas O'Cyr Post 147. Caron married Aline Picard (1912-1995); they lived in Lille, Maine. Caron died on May 20, 1983.

Scope and content:

This collection consists of a recording of songs performed by Octave F. Caron, Jr. "and friends," including Alma Toussaint Caron (Pascal's wife) and Cyr Corbin. The first set of songs was recorded at the home of Pascal Caron in St. David, Maine, in 1979. Pascal was Octave's paternal uncle. The second set was recorded at Mount Carmel Church in Lille, Maine, on July 16, 1978. The second set includes Octave, his wife, Aline P. Caron, Lawrence Parent, Andre Cyr, Lucille Parent, and other parishioners. Included is a speech given by Lawrence Parent. The songs are mostly in French. Also included is a photocopied manuscript track listing.
