Biographical information:

Yvette Saucier was born on May 17, 1918 in Van Buren, Maine, the daughter of Henry J. and Victoria (Martin) Saucier. She attended local schools and graduated from Sacred Heart High School in 1935 and Madawaska Training School in Fort Kent in 1937. She taught at Sacred Heart Elementary School from 1937 until 1941; she also taught in Hamlin's one-room schoolhouse, which is now located in Van Buren's Acadian Village.

Yvette married Richard B. Stewart in August, 1941. After briefly living in Bangor, they moved to Fort Kent, where they resided for eight years, before relocating to Van Buren. There, they raised three daughters: Kathleen (Stewart) Beaulieu, Dorothy Stewart, and Cindy (Stewart) Martel.

Scope and content:

This collection consists of two photographs and a necklace. The necklace is from the Madawaska Training School. It bears the Maine state seal on the front and the engraved initials "Y.P.S." on the reverse. The first photograph is a black and white image of the Madawaska Training School men's basketball team, noted as "Normal Champs, '35-'36." The second photograph is a color image of Yvette Stewart; while undated, it most likely was taken near the date of the collection's donation to the archives.

Inventory:

Processing action: The 2 photos were inserted in a clear plastic sleeve for preservation. The necklace was wrapped in tissue paper and placed in its original plastic box inside an 11 cm x 13.5 cm envelope and kept in the folder (UM-352)
