**Biographical information:** Martha Belle Greene was born May 5, 1887 in Gorham, New Hampshire, daughter of Harry B.C. Greene and Carrie E. Philbrook. She married Henry Hudson Kalloch of Presque Isle, Maine, on July 14, 1915. Martha was an instructor at the Madawaska Training School in 1914-1915. She died November 3, 1918, in Houlton, Maine at the age of 31.

**Scope and content:** This collection consists of correspondence written by Martha Belle Greene to her beau, Henry H. Kalloch of Vanceboro, Maine. It includes 2 undated handwritten letters with stamped envelopes dated November 2, 1914 and May 1915 and sent from Fort Kent, Maine to Vanceboro, Maine. In her letters, Miss Greene talks about events and personal experiences while working at the Madawaska Training School in 1914-1915.
