Esther (Scottie) Scott was born in Eagle Lake, Me, on April 18, 1930. She is the daughter of Mabel Dubé of Winterville and Phillip Scott of Eagle Lake. She studied at the town schools until she was 14, when she left to become a mother's helper for the Page family in Fort Kent. She continued her education at Madawaska Training School and worked for

Drs. Maurice and Normand Cyr. She married J. Lionel Pelletier of Connors, New Brunswick, on November 27, 1950. They raised a family of six children in Clair, N.B., where she still resides.

This collection consists of a brown scapular of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, depicting the act of Mary giving the scapular to St. Simon Stock in 1251. Scapulars are sacred religious objects in the Catholic Church.
