Historical note: The United States Geological Survey was established on March 3, 1879. Scope and content: This collection consists of 4 topographical maps prepared and produced by the U.S. Geological Survey. Map 1, Van Buren, was prepared for publication by the Defense Mapping Agency Hydrographic / Topographic Center in Washington, D.C. in 1979. Maps 2, 3, and 4, Fort Kent South, Fort Kent North, and Eagle Lake were compiled from aerial photographs taken in 1982 and edited in 1985. The regions depicted on maps 1, 2, and 3 are from both sides of the St. John River in Maine and New Brunswick.
