**Biographical information:** Leora Dubay is the daughter of Sylvio and Gertrude Dubay. She was born in Winterville, Maine and attended Ricker Classical Institute High School in Houlton, Maine from 1945 to 1949. She married Armand Richard Roy who was born in Frenchville, Maine, and died on October 20, 2005. Leora now lives in Florida with her second husband, Don Rives.

**Historical notes:** *American Art Post Card Co.* (1915-1953) was a publisher of black and white collotypes (photomechanical printing process), and tinted halftone view-cards. They used the trade name *Photolux* on many cards. Most of their white border cards were contracted out to Curt Teich. These cards are often recognizable by their blocky titles and numbers.

**Scope and content:** This collection consists of 2 black and white images of the Fort Kent Training School gymnasium around the 1950s. One of the images is a 3.5 in. x 2.5 in. black and white photograph of the MTS gymnasium circa 1950. This photograph has the letters "M.T.S" and "GYM" written on the front. The second image is a 5.5 in. x 3.5 in. black and white unmailed postcard of the *TRAINING SCHOOL GYMNASIUM, FORT KENT, MAINE 3765* written in block letters on the front. On the back of the postcard is the publisher *AMERICAN ART POSTCARD CO., BOSTON, MASS.* and the trade name *PHOTOLUX*.
