Collection Description

Historical and Biographical Information

Robert Daigle is the son of Zenon Daigle of Fort Kent and Beatrice Jacques of Soldier Pond, Maine. He is a teacher of French for the Maine School Administrative District #27. Robert is

very dedicated and passionate about his French roots. He is an advisor for the French Club at the high school where he works and was responsible for a French Exchange Program in 2013 with students from France. He was also responsible for some of his students attending the 2012 Youth Festival in Nova Scotia. During the school year 2011-2012 he started a monthly French newspaper "Gazettes des guerriers". Robert is married to Jessica and they have 2 daughters.

Zenon A. Daigle is the son of Ludger and Azilda Daigle born July 8, 1929 and died February 10, 2011 at the age of 81. He enlisted in the National Guard in May 1948 and honorably discharged in July 1959 with the rank of sergeant. He ran a seed potato farm for 35 years, raised cattle and cut lumber. After retirement he substituted as a bus driver and janitor for SAD 27 for 20 years. He served on the board of directors for Farmers Home Administration for 17 years. He was a Legion of Honor member of Catholic Order of Foresters, serving the St. Louis Court 230 in various offices from 1966 till 2011. He was also a 4th Knight of Columbus Council no. 0352, Fort Kent. He loved dancing, cooking breakfast on the fireplace at camp and playing cards with his family.

Beatrice Jacques Daigle is the daughter of Adrian Oreni Jacques and Bertha Regina Theriault. She married Zenon A. Daigle.

Cecilia Jacques Michaud is the daughter of Adrian Oreni Jacques and Bertha Regina Theriault. Cecilia married Norman Michaud of St. Agatha on August 20, 1946.

Scope and Content
