**Biographical information:**

**Frank R. (Raymond) Soeder** was born in Ohio on August 4, 1917. Frank enlisted in the army in March 1944, during World War II, as an aviation cadet in the Air Corps and was released in May 1946. He worked as an immigration and naturalization inspector with the Van Buren, Maine

office of the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS). Frank was married to Camilla and had one son, Fred. Mr. Soeder died on September 22, 2001 in Van Buren, Maine. He was an avid fisherman and hunter.

**Donald McEdward** was born in Union, Maine to Donald Gordon McEdward and Vera Perry. From an interview with Terrie Cornell in 1989, Mr. McEdward was 23 years old when he was employed as a Border Patrol agent in Houlton, Maine on March 1, 1944. He was immediately sent for a three months training in El Paso, Texas for this duty. On his return to Houlton, Mr. McEdward was stationed in Fort Kent, Maine and spent the summer of 1944 at the mouth of the Big Black River building camp Quinton for the Border Patrol. The camp was named after Stanley Quinton, a Border Patrol agent killed in World War II. In September 1949, the Fort Kent office was closed and agents were transferred to Van Buren, Maine. Donald McEdward left the area in 1949 to go work as a Border Patrol agent in New York. After New York, he came back to Jackman, Maine, transferred to Rouses Point, N.Y., and then to Chula (Vista, CA) in 1955. Mr. McEdward was chief in Houlton from 1974 to 1977 when he retired.

He married Marie Clara Dubois in Fort Kent, Maine on December 4, 1947. They had 2 children: Donna Norma and Donald Angus.

**Willard Jalbert Jr.** was born on July 17, 1919, the son of Willard Jalbert and Mary Bourgoyne. He grew up in a family with strong ties to the river.

From Beurmond Banville's article in the Bangor Daily News of March 7, 2005, he mentions that Mr. Jalbert was sled dog racing in Fort Kent decades before it was the biggest event of the year. He used to run a ragtag team of local mutts harnessed to a homemade sled, giving rides to his wife, six kids and other neighborhood children. He was a policeman for a time, and later did surveillance at the port of entry with U.S. Customs. A fun-loving man, devoted to his family and his community, he was a member of the local board of education fighting for programs for girls, a subject close to his heart because of his five daughters. He died a young man, still in his 50s, in a fiery crash with his only son, Billy, on February 2, 1976 returning home after watching his daughter Bonnie's basketball team at Eastern Maine Basketball Tournament in Bangor.

Willard Jalbert Jr. with his brother Robert Jalbert and their father Willard Sr. built camps in the late 1940s on Round Pond, Township 13 Range 12 in the heart of the Allagash Wilderness Waterway. The camps are accessible only by canoe or float plane.

Willard Jalbert Jr. married Blanche Cyr on July 8, 1940 and they had the following children: Maxine Blanche, Phyllis Ann, Susan Marie, Patricia Mae, Willard Joseph III (born in 1958 and died on 2 Feb 1976 in an automobile accident), and Bernice Claire (Bonnie).

**Samuel G. Gallu**, a playwright and independent television and film producer from Solebury, Pa. He was the author of "Give 'Em Hell, Harry," a play about Harry S. Truman that was produced on Broadway in 1975 with James Whitmore as its star. He also wrote for radio and television, and in the early 1950's founded his own production company, Gallu Productions in Hollywood. The company created television series like "Border Patrol," "Navy Log" and "The Blue Angel."

**Historical information:** With the appointment of Jefferson Davis Milton in 1904 as the first Special Officer to police the (Southern) Frontier, the foundation of the Immigration Border Patrol was laid. The act creating the Immigration Border Patrol as an organization was passed May 28, 1924, when Congress provided \$1,000,000 to be expended for an additional land border patrol. One of the major duties of the Patrol Inspectors was to assist the Federal Prohibition Agents to interdict the illicit flow of alcoholic beverages across the borders.

The Houlton Border Patrol headquarters was established in 1924 and began operations out of a small building on Bangor Street. The sector was composed of seven of Maine's counties: Aroostook, Franklin, Hancock, Penobscot, Piscataquis, Washington and Somerset.

Up until the World War II era most of the work in which the Border Patrol became involved was centered in the vast forests and agricultural areas of Maine. The Border Patrol Agent had to be a versatile man who could ride the white waters of the Allagash streams, lead as many as fifty French Canadians handcuffed to each other over a 40 mile snowshoe trail, camp alone in the deep woods, live off the land, and at the same time have a thorough knowledge of the laws he had taken an oath to enforce. The romantic challenge offered by the job as Border Patrol Agent attracted many Maine men who today remember the hardships and frustrations they suffered as "the good old days."<sup>1</sup>

**Scope and content:** This collection consists of 581 photographs, 161 slides, publications, correspondence, newspaper articles, calendars, reports, transcription of an interview with Donald McEdward from 1989, and a document related to a proposal by Mr. Samuel Gallu for a Border Patrol television series in 1956.

Many photographs are related to a story written by Mr. Samuel Gallu on Patrol Inspectors Willard 'Baptiste' Jalbert, Mr. Scribner, Frank Soeder, and Donald McEdward who were instructed to proceed to Townships 15 and 16, Range 15 (Wels, Aroostook County, Maine) to apprehend Canadian subjects who were working on the American side without any bonds, nor horses that had passed by the U.S. Customs. Two camps and other small shacks had been set-up to cut one million feet of lumber. All violators of the Immigration laws were to be brought out of the woods for prosecution by the U. S. attorney in Bangor, Maine.
