#### **Collection Description**

Historical and Biographical Information

Saint-François de Madawaska was organized, first, as a mission by Father Henri Dionne who was vicar in Saint-Basile from 1841 to 1843 and then became the first priest in the Sainte-Luce

Parish of Frenchville, Maine. In 1842, all of New Brunswick was set-up as a diocese with the episcopal in Fredericton till 1852 when it was transferred to Saint John, N.B. During the course of history, the parish is known to have had 3 churches. The exact date when the first Church was built is unknown but the date for the concession of the land by the government of New Brunswick was January 9, 1849. It was believed that the beginning of construction of this first church was the venture of Father Henri Dionne in 1842 and Saint François-Xavier was a mission of Sainte Luce. This church, ravaged by fire in 1886, was known as l'*église rouge*. At the time of the fire, Father Joseph Martin was the priest.

The new priest, Father Phydime Paradis, saw to the construction of a sencond church, *l'église blanche*, where the first mass was celebrated on June 29, 1888. During a thunderstorm, this church was hit by lightning and reduced to ashes on May 10, 1920. On May 15, 1921, Father Télesphore Lambert took charge of the Saint-François parish and his first task was the construction of a third church and a new rectory. First mass in this unfinished church took place on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1929. All three churches were constructed at different sites in the parish<sup>1</sup>.

#### Scope and Content

This collection consists of one 10 x 8 inch black and white photograph depicting 14 priests who served the Parish of Saint-François de Madawaska from 1859 through 1975. Their names and dates served appear under their photos. They include Reverend Fathers Charles Sweron, J. C. Ethier, Joseph A. Roy, Dougal Stanislas MacDonald, Jean B. Bagoge, Joseph Martin, Antoine Comeau, Télesphore Lambert, Israel-Norbert Dumont, Phydime Paradis, Joseph Pelletier, Hilaire Daigle, Ernest Lang, Alfred Ouellet. The photo has a stamp of "Studio William, Edmundston, N.B." in the back.
