Biographical information: Bernard Saucier was born in November of 1923 in Wallagrass, Maine, the son of Oscar Saucier and Isabelle Bouchard Saucier. Enlisting in the US Army at the age of 20 on March 08, 1943, Bernard was a private in the branch of the Selectees during World

War II. At the time of enlistment, Bernard Saucier was single, without dependents. Bernard married Lorraine Bergeron in St. André Parish in Biddeford, Maine on June 29, 1946. He died on October 27, 2007 at the age of 83.

Scope and content: This collection consists of audio recordings of Mr. Bernard 'Ben' Saucier by his grandson, Jason Saucier, done in November 2001. The recordings were done on 3 microcassettes, a 4th one was blank, and on 1 Smart Media memory card (a 2nd media card was blank). Of importance in these discussions are Mr. Saucier's experiences as a soldier in World War II; his boat building ability; maple sugar camp; growing-up on a farm; his job occupations. The length of the recordings is approximately 2½ hours. The sound is poor to good throughout the recordings. The recordings were transferred on 3 archival compact discs.

The original recordings on micro-cassettes and memory cards were placed in an envelope in a file with shelf list number UM-431.
