No biographical information for Stephen Ellwood is available.

James R. Connors was born in St. Francis, Maine, on June 13, 1907, the son of David and Mary (O'Leary) Connors. He was a noted poet and storyteller throughout the state, but especially in the Saint John Valley. Connors also taught in the Allagash school system. He was a member of the Fort Kent Masonic Lodge 209, the Royal Arc Chapter of Caribou, the Houlton Commandry, and the Anah Temple Shrine of Bangor. Connors died on December 29, 1997, at the age of 90.
