## **Collection Description**

#### **Biographical Information**

## Historical Information

A *catalogne* has its origins in Europe. *L'encyclopédie de l'artisnat : Bois et Textiles, 1975*, says that it holds its name from Sieur de Catalan who lived in the 17th century. At that time, the *catalogne* was a carpet. It has been brought to Quebec as a carpet but it was turned into a bed blanket in the Quebec area. A traditional *catalogne* is woven on a loom with strips of old clothes while the commercial ones are of new material.

## Scope and Content

This collection consists of one *catalogne* (material woven from strips of old colored fabrics). This *catalogne* was woven by the *Cercle de fermières de la Durantaye*, a region in the province of Quebec, and was made to be used as a stair runner. The *catalogne* measures 19 feet long by 22 inches wide with raspberry red, beige, green, and blue colors. It was bought by the Acadian Archives to be part of their permanent collection.
