### **Collection Description**

### Historical and Biographical Information

Marc Chasse was born in Ste, Agathae, Maine and grew up in the Saint John Valley region. In addition to working as a chiropractor, he has been involved in a number of community and civic organizations and worked to preserve the Valley's history.

The Fort Kent Outdoor Center has held a number of Biathlon events since its creation in 1999, Olympic qualifying races. These events have transformed the Center into an internationally known training center and gained Fort Kent the nickname 'the little town that could' after they put on the 2004 World Cup attracting over 20,000 spectators from around the world.

The Can-Am Crown international sled dog races are an annual weekend-long competition that started in 1992. Musher and their teams can compete in 30, 100, or 250 mile races that start and finish in Fort Kent, Maine events are put on for spectators. This is the biggest competition of its kind on the East Coast and draws racers from across North America.

The 2008 flood that affected Fort Kent and surrounding towns in the Saint John Valley region when the Saint John and Fish Rivers flooded, leaving many parts of the towns near these towns submerged in water. The effects were devastating.

### Scope and Content

This collection is split into three series, the first of which has two subseries. Subseries 1a contains memorabilia from the 2005 biathlon including a schedule of events for half the week, information sessions for the Fort Kent community and an advertisement poster. Subseries 1b consists of newspaper clippings covering the event, its athletes and community involvement.

Series 2: Can-Am Crown sled dog races (2005, 2010) is made up of newspaper clippings covering the annual can-am crown races in 2005 and 2010. Series 3: 2008 St. John River Flood consists of newspaper clippings from various Maine newspapers, such as the *Bangor Daily News*, *Saint John Valley Times*, *Portland Press Herald* and the *Morning Sentinel* coverage on the 2008 Flood that happened when the Saint John and Fish Rivers overran and caused major damage.

### Arrangement

This collection has been divided into three series, and two subseries. Series 1 2005 IPC World Championship Biathlon (split into two subseries); Subseries 1a: Memorabilia; Subseries 1b: Newspaper clippings; Series 2: Can-Am Crown sled dog races (2005, 2010) & Series 3: 2008 St. John River Flood. The processing archivist tried to keep the original order of the collection, but rearranged some articles to put them in chronological order or keep duplicates together. Most of the series are in chronological order, but due to the fact that not all of the articles are dated or kept together if they were from different pages, this was not possible for the whole collection.
