### **Collection Description**

#### Historical and Biographical Information

Joseph Albert was born in Fort Kent on September 5th, 1953, the youngest of twelve children. He was an avid hiker, a skilled carpenter, wood craftsman and renowned bowl-turner. He passed away unexpectedly in 2020.

The ash basket, 1 live edge maple bowl and 1 bird peck maple bowl were purchased by the archives for permanent exhibit on 2019-09-16. It is possible the other baskets and bowls were bought as well, but documentation has not been confirmed by the processing archivist at this time.

### Scope and Content

This collection consists of four hand-made wooden bowls. Two are live edge maple bowls that are more oval shaped. The other two are slightly smaller and rounder in shape and made of bird peck maple.

The other three baskets are woven and have alternating natural tan and pinkish-red color. One basket has a cover with a handle. The second is a slightly smaller basket that has curled strips of wood woven into the foot in triangle shapes to help support the basket stand up on its own. The last basket has a wide and shallow rim with the same color pattern as the previous basket as well as the same curled pieces in triangular shapes around the edge.

1 ash basket roughly 16x6x12” in diameter.
