Collection Description

Historical and Biographical Information

Lucien and Ida (Goodbout) Jandreau are natives of Aroostook county. Lucien grew up in St. Francis and worked in the woods and on the river rafting logs down to the mills. Ida grew up in Allagash. Lucien met Ida when he was working on the river with her uncle and fell in love.

Lucien joined the Marine Corps in 1944 and served in the South Pacific and China before returning home in 1947, and married Ida the same year. The two had nine children whom they raised in St. Francis. At the time this article was written, the two still lived in their home in St. Francis.

Scope and Content

Series I contains a published article on Lucien and Idas' lives as well as documents pertaining to their family genealogy. Series II consists of a CD recording of Luciens's parents singing and playing the harmonica as well as a document containing the transcriptions and translations of a couple songs his grandmother sung. Series III is made up of photographs from the Jandreau and Goodbout families. Goodbout is Ida's maiden name. These include pictures of Ida and Lucien, their parents, siblings, and children. Descriptions of the photographs are provided in the collection inventory below but also have descriptions written on the back of the photographs.
