#### **Collection Description**

Historical and Biographical Information

Venney Marquis Bolduc was born to Joseph Benoit Marquis and ANastasie Nadeau on June 17th 1918 in Caron Brook, New Brunswick.

She attended grammar school in Baker Brook, N.B. Then the Marquis family moved to Fort Kent, Maine in 1935 and Veney went to 8th grade in English to "qualify" for high school. She decided to enter the convent at Baie St. Paul (Quebec) with the order of the Little Franciscans of Mary. While a postulant, she became ill and returned home, spending time with doctors trying to get a diagnosis (1936-1938). For part of this time, Venney wsa cared for by her aunt, Georgianne Nadeau, an R.N. in Portland. She became a naturalized citizen in 1949.

Once she recovered, Venney returned to Fort Kent, where she went to high school and graduated in 1941. While in school she started working for the Bangor Daily News and the J.C.Penney store as a sales person and window dresser. Later Venney worked at the Oxford Paper Co. in St. Just. During World War II, she served on the civil patrol and also worked as a switchboard operator in Fort Kent. She was very active in the church choir and community activities.

After graduation, Venney worked even more and socialized with friends and family. In 1943, she met a dark handsome fellow and her dreams of a religious life disappeared. She married Roland Bolduc in 1945 and moved with him and their growing family at Roland's work sites in lumbering operations in Fort Kent and Rumford.

For the three years before her death, Venney and her husband lived with their daughter Claire in Orono, ME. Venney was a passionate gardener and cook. She was a communicant of the Parish of the Resurrection of the Lord and active in the church as well as the communities she lived in. She contributed to the following organizations: the Acadian Society, Santa's Helpers, and St. Athanasius-St. John Church fundraisers.

For many years she prepared thanksgiving baskets, collected, cleaned and donated household goods, and always planned how to please family and friends around holidays. Her joyfulness and laughter will be treasured always. At the time of her death (January 5, 2013) Venney had four children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren.
