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Collection Description

Historical and Biographical Information

Paula (Collins) Marquis is from the Pleasant Street area of Fort Kent and attended the Fort Kent State Teachers College (FKSTC) (former name of UMFK) from 1963-1967. Her mother was a librarian for the college with Louis Petet. She studied their education program and went on to work as a teacher. She currently resides in southern Maine.

The University of Maine at Fort Kent was formerly known as the Fort Kent State Teachers College among a few other names throughout its history. At its founding in 1878, the college was named the Madawaska Training School. In 1955 the institution's name was changed to Fort Kent State Normal School. In 1961 it was changed to Fort Kent State Teachers College. In 1966, the institution's name was changed to Fort Kent State College. In 1968 the institution was renamed as the Fort Kent State College of the University of Maine. In 1979, the college had its last name change [to date], becoming the University of Maine at Fort Kent.

For much of its history, the University of Maine at Fort Kent was a teaching college. It wasn't until the last couple of decades that the college started to move away from a focus on teaching programs. Now [at the time of this finding aid] the university is known for its nursing, conservation law, and forestry programs.

Scope and Content

Paula and her mother collected the newspaper articles preserved in this collection. The other materials preserved in these scrapbooks pertain to her time at the Fort Kent State Teachers College (1963-1967).

Newspaper clippings (local [Saint John Valley] papers)

Issues of the school newspaper, "The Bengals Roar"

Event programs

Invitations to building dedications

Envelopes for invitations to events not related to the school (weddings and parties)

Arrangement

These two scrapbooks were left in their original form. Because of the high volume of loose-leaf materials and the loose binding of the scrapbooks, all loose materials tucked into the scrapbooks were taken out and put in folders. The processing archivist kept in the order these materials were found in and noted their location in the scrapbooks (i.e. inside front or back cover, tucked between specific pages). One or two loose leaf scraps that appeared as if they were originally glued to the scrapbook pages but whose adhesive had worn off were left as they were.

This collection was not divided into series as it is a small collection.

Separated Materials (If Applicable)

Loose-leaf materials that were tucked into the scrapbooks were removed and put in folders to preserve the shape of the scrapbooks as well as prevent them from being lost/scattered when the scrapbooks are handled. Their original order was kept however.
