Collection Description

Historical and Biographical Information

This reel contains indexes, record books, & plans relevant to the registration of land transferrals recorded via the registry office of New Brunswick.

“Since its establishment in 1967-68, the Provincial Archives has maintained a vibrant program of microfilming New Brunswick documents, of collecting records on microfilm relevant to New Brunswick which are housed in other archives, and of lending through the mail its microfilms to other institutions world wide. The goal of the microfilming program has been to provide as much information as possible to as many as possible in order to facilitate research of all kinds.

“This Guide to Microfilms at P.A.N.B is the first effort of the Archies to make available for wide distribution a listing of its entire microfilms holdings. With this in mind, a number of points about the GUIDE must be explained for the sake of those wishing to make use of it:

- This guide is an alphabetically-arranged index to the microfilms. The purpose of this arrangement is to allow access by subject to the massive amount of information available.
 - Researchers should exercise a great deal of caution when using the guide, because although every microfilm is included, not all microfilms are indexed to the same level. More detail and assistance on the films is often found in the finding aids, inventories, etc. found at the P.A.N.B
- As noted in the heading to each page, the films containing the indexes, record books, and plans relevant to the registration of land transferrals which are recorded in each registry office have not been added to the index. A number of factors such as illegibility of some films, incomprehensibility of some indexes and multiple filings have contributed to this decision. A new edition of this guide could result in better records.
- All microfilms at P.A.N.B. are designated by an F number beginning with F1
- The dates included in the Guide are for the material being described- not the entire film. These dates give only a broad range or indication of the time period the records cover or as in the case of published items, the date of publication.
- Where applicable, the guide also includes the “locale” as an indicator of the city, town, community, or area to which the records generally relate. When the records cover the entire Province or region, no locale is specified.
- Where applicable, the specific county has been included when the records apply to that county. When many or all counties are included in the records, no county is specified.
- “RS/MC#” refers to the archival designation of the items at P.A.N.B. These stand for record series and manuscript collection respectively.
- “P” is a designation that has been added to the entries where the item has been published.
- “R” is used in a few cases where records on the microfilms aren’t available for public inspection either because of the wishes of the donor in the case of manuscript records or because legislation in the case of Government Records. In these cases, an “R” will appear immediately in front of the F number.”¹
