Collection Description

Historical and Biographical Information

Laurel J. Daigle has lived, worked, and raised a family in Fort Kent. He was born in 1939, the son of Alcide Hilaire Daigle and Gertrude (Daigle) Daigle. Mr. Daigle graduated from the Madawaska Training School with the class of 1960. He was president of the Alumni Association in 1964. Laurel worked as a guidance director at the Fort Kent Community High School. He was the owner of Country Cottage in Fort Kent. He's also the author of local history volumes such as *Fort Kent (Images of America); A chronological history: Fort Kent's Saint Louis Catholic Church; History of public education in Maine School Administrative District No. 27: a long tradition of service and excellence; Holy family Parish, Daigle, Maine, 1906-2000: commemorating 94 years of ministry.* Furthermore, Laurel was a member of the Fort Kent Historical Society for many years.

The town of Fort Kent was established in 1869 on the land a Fort was built during the Aroostook War between Maine and Canada. The fort was abandoned after the Washburn-Ashburton treaty was signed and later passed into private hands before being given back to the Park Service. The images in this collection highlight different aspects/institutions of the town's history from the local church to the blockhouse, to the mills to the railroad industry that not only transported lumber but for a time, people as well.

Scope and Content

This collection is mostly made up of postcards and images collected from a variety of sources. Some of the images belonged to Laurel and his family; others he bought or collected from ebay and other stores over the years. Some of the images had descriptions that were copied into the inventory in parenthesis. Any messages written on postcards were summarized in the description column. All dates assigned to postcards/images are from post office stamp dates or date stamps on the back of images rather than creation dates, which are often unknown. If postcards/images are undated, no dates are listed, or in a few cases were too faded to read.

A portion of this collection is made up of biographical information on members of the clergy and 'Little Franciscans of Mary' nuns that served in the Saint John Valley. These materials were compiled and researched by the donor, Laurel Daigle.

Arrangement

This collection was brought to the Archives in three photograph binders that each fit into a box-like case. The photographs and postcards were housed in non-archival sleeves without clear order. The processing archivist transferred the postcards and photographs into archival-grade sleeves, which were then put into an archival photographic storage box. Because the materials from this collection were brought in at different times over the course of a couple of months, they were split into two parts reflecting this. Part one was the first batch of images donated and part 2 was the second batch. Researchers will notice the series in each part have duplicated subjects and in some cases, duplicate images, but were kept separate to reflect the additions to

the collection. The processing archivist also gave the postcards/images a number to signify the order they were put in. Part 3 was donated in November and consists of the manuscript materials on members of the religious order that served in the Saint John Valley, a notice from the Fort Kent Trust Company, and a bonhomme gigueur¹.

The processing archivist rearranged the items into twenty-five series by subject. These are as follows: Part 1: Series I: Panoramic views; Series II: Suspension bridge/ferry; Series III: Fort Kent; Series IV: Blockhouse; Series V: Churches; Series VI: Madawaska Training School (MTS); Series VII: Rail Road; Series VIII: Mills; Series IX: Miscellaneous people; Part 2: Series X: Panoramic views of Fort Kent and surrounding rivers; Series XI: Bridges/Ferry; Series XII: Fort Kent town scenes; Subseries I: Businesses/Downtown; Subseries II: Unlabeled buildings/personal residences; Subseries III: Dance Card; Series XIII: Blockhouse; Series XIV: Railroad; Series XV: Churches; Subseries I: Presbyterian church; Subseries II: Catholic churches; Series XVI: Primary school education; Series XVII: Madawaska Training School (MTS); Series XVIII: Agriculture/potato farming; Series XIX: Textiles/mills/logging; Series XX: People (miscellaneous/ without a clear affiliation); Series XXI: Laurel Daigle & family; Series XXII: State Normal School, Farmington, Me; Part 3: Series XXIII: Religious orders serving the Saint John Valley; Series XXIV: Receipt for a check from the Fort Kent Trust Company; Series XXV: bonhomme gigueur.
