Collection Description

Historical and Biographical Information

Starting in 1978, the Madawaska Acadian Festival is held annually to celebrate the Acadian Culture and history of the Saint John Valley in Northern Maine. The festival runs for a week with

family friendly activities held each day including a tintamarre parade held on Acadian Day (August 15th).

Since its first year, the festival has served as a reason for many of the Acadian and French-Canadian families from the region to gather for a family reunion and celebration. From 1980 through the mid 2010s, the planning committee for the festival would choose a different family each year to honor and their family genealogy would be researched and compiled into books which were then given to the family. Part of this celebration would include researching or choosing a family crest to display (it was often found that different lines of a family would have different crests over the years so the family would decide on a version that best represented them.) Around 2015, the tradition of choosing a family to research stopped, but the festival is still a popular event for residents of the Valley and is well attended each year.

It should be noted that the festival wasn't always held in August around the week of Acadian Day, but for a few years in the early days of the festival, held in June around Maine Acadian Day.

In 2022-2023, Don Raymond, who grew up on the Saint John Valley and has recorded local events, reached out to quilters Sue Corriveau and Paula Bouchard about creating this quilt. Wanting their work of art to be available to the people of the Saint John Valley, Don loaned it to the Acadian Archives on a permanent basis with the stipulation that it can be loaned to other institutions in the Valley and/or brought to the Acadian Festival upon request. The Archives was happy to accept this loan and proudly displays the quilt in their research room for all to enjoy.

Scope and Content

The quilt depicts the family crests of the families honored at the Madawaska Acadian Festival from the years 1980-2014 along with the Acadian Landing cross. Images of each crest and the cross were printed onto the quilt and the fleur-de-lis pattern was stitched into the quilt numerous times.
