Cecile Marquis Picard was born on August 20, 1906 in St. Hilaire, New Brunswick, the daughter of Honore and Elizabeth Michaud Marquis. She married Henry Picard (Joseph Henri Picard) on February 12, 1929; they lived in Madawaska, Maine. Cecile Picard died August 12, 1976.
