One black-and-white photograph of Mr. Morin playing the fiddle, and a typed report (16 pages of text, 4 sheets of drawings and notes) on the lives of Mr. and Mrs. Smith. Submitted for a course at the University of Maine at Fort Kent in Spring 1974.

Scope and Content Note: The audiocassettes and audio reels are mostly interviews in French and English. 3 audio cassettes containing oral history interviews in French with Mr. Fred Levesque of Van Buren. Mr. Fred Levesque talks about family life, farming, religion. 2 audiocassettes containing oral history interview in French and English with Mr. Herbert Smith of Van Buren. Mr. Herbert Smith talks about family life, weather lore, tracking animals, saw mills. (4 sheets of drawings and notes pertaining to Mr. Smith interview). 2 reels containing fiddle, harmonica and spoon playing and an oral interview in French with Mr. Sam Morin of Van Buren. Mr. Sam Morin plays his fiddle, harmonica and spoons and talks about family life. 1 black-and-white photograph of Mr. Morin playing the fiddle. A typed report (16 pages of text) that Mr. Stephen Cyr wrote as a resume of all the interviews.

(As of October 2010, Mrs. Thérèse Jacques interview has not been found)

All the interviewees are from Van Buren, Maine.

These interviews were submitted for a course at the University of Maine at Fort Kent in the Spring of 1974.

Processing:

Audiocassettes: When the 5 master audiocassettes were received, they were probably copied on 5 use audiocassettes for patron use. The staff did not realize that not all interviews were included at the time. The interviews with Sam Morin and Thérèse Jacques were missing.

In 2005, Blake Library staff had the task of digitizing the content of 5 audiocassettes onto archival gold compact discs for preservation. White label compact discs for patron use were also created. See concordances below.

Processing:

16 pages of manuscript and photograph: Some papers were stapled together with the staples already rusted. Those stapled were taken off and replaced with archival quality staples, 100% rust proof. The photograph of Mr. Sam Morin was placed into clear plastic sleeve for preservation.

Processing:

2 reels of ¹/4" **audio tape**: In October 2010, 2 reels were digitized and transferred on archival gold compact discs for preservation and white label compact discs for patron use were also made. On the 2 reels was the music and interview with Mr. Sam Morin.
