Serials

The Library currently subscribes to 335 titles, 121 of those titles are in fields related to Natural and Behavioral Sciences. In addition to the titles held locally in paper format, many of the databases to which we subscribe provide full-text access to a number of additional titles.

In FY03, the library acquisition budget spent 30.3% in the areas of Natural and Behavioral Science, 22.9% in Nursing, 15.5% in Humanities, and 14.3% in Education.

In FY04, the numbers were 42.2% spent in the Natural and Behavioral Science, 24.4% in Humanities, 18% in Nursing, 10.9% in Education.

Databases

Students have access to a number of databases related to Natural and Behavioral Sciences. The list below does not include all the databases.

- Academic Search Premier - Provides full text for nearly 3,300 scholarly publications of which 2,400 are peer reviewed. Academic areas of study include: social sciences, humanities, education, computer sciences, engineering, language and linguistics, arts & literature, medical sciences, and ethnic studies.
- Access UN - Index to United Nations documents and publications. Provides full-text access to publications of the General Assembly, the Security Council, and the Economic and Social Council.
- Access Science - Encyclopedia of Science and Technology is the searchable online version of the McGraw-Hill Encyclopedia of Science and Technology and the McGraw-Hill Dictionary of Scientific and Technical Terms. It provides access to over 7,000 encyclopedia articles and links to relevant, quality web sites. There are over 2,000 biographies of scientists and it also includes articles on important news events in science and technology. Definitions are provided for over 115,000 terms. Browse major subject areas and their sub-topics or search for specific articles or definitions.
- Agricola - Index to materials acquired by the National Agricultural Library and co-operating institutions. Includes journal articles, monographs, series, and materials in many non-print formats covering a broad range of agricultural topics including forestry. 1979-1985 international in scope. 1985+ focuses on U.S. related publications
- Agricultural Statistics - Statistical compendium issued yearly by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, covering agricultural production, supplies, consumption, facilities, costs, and returns.
- America History and Life - Index to research on the history of the United States and Canada, from prehistoric times to the present. Includes references to journal articles, books and book reviews, dissertations, and collective works.

- Annals of American History – Provides access to over 2,100 original full-text source documents on United States history from 1493 to the present. Includes speeches, essays, biographies, landmark court decisions, poems, interviews, and editorials from more than 1,500 authors.
- Anthropological Index of the Royal Anthropological Institute - Index to the more than 600 periodical included in the Anthropological Index to Current Periodicals in the Museum of Mankind Library. Topics covered include archaeology, ethnomusicology, physical and cultural anthropology and human biology. Search by author, title, keyword, or journal title (or combine terms). (If search form is incomplete, click Reload button.) International in scope.
- BIOSIS Previews- Worldwide in scope, BIOSIS Previews, the premier database in the biological sciences, indexes the literature of the biological and biomedical sciences. Subject coverage includes agriculture, biochemistry, bioengineering, botany, ecology, forestry, genetics, microbiology, pharmacology, and zoology. Approximately 5,500 serial publications as well as books, proceedings and meeting abstracts, technical reports, review papers, and patents are indexed. There are 58 separate data fields that can be searched including author, title, publication source, organism, concepts, super taxa, publication type, author affiliation, and abstract keyword. Searches can be limited to review articles. Updated weekly
- Business and Company Resource Center – Comprehensive source of information for conducting company, industry and market research. Provides access to the contents of over 4,000 business and economics periodicals (over 3,000 with full-text coverage). Also includes the contents of key reference works such as Ward's Business Directory of U.S. Private and Public Companies, Business Rankings Annual, International Directory of Company Histories, Market Share Reporter and Encyclopedia of Associations.
- Business Source Premier – Provides full text for more than 2,800 scholarly business journals of which 912 are peer reviewed. Coverage includes: management, economics, finance, accounting, international business and much more.
- Child Abuse, Child Welfare and Adoption Database – Contains 32,000+ bibliographic citations and abstracts of professional literature, primarily of U.S. origin. Publication types include books, journals, government reports, conference papers, state annual reports, curricula, and unpublished papers. Updated annually.
- Contemporary Women's Issues – Contemporary Women's Issues (CWI) is a multidisciplinary, full-text database that brings together relevant content from mainstream periodicals, gray literature, and the alternative press -- with a focus on the critical issues and events that influence women's lives in more than 190 countries. Contemporary Women's Issues includes English-language titles from East and West Africa, Asia, and South and Central America, the Caribbean, North America and Europe. Updated weekly.
- CQ Researcher – Explores a single hot issue in the news in depth each week. Topics range from social and teen issues to environment, health, education and science and technology. There are 44 reports produced each year including four expanded reports.
- EconLit - Contains citations and abstracts to economic research dating back to 1969. Provides comprehensive information on accounting, capital markets, econometrics, economic forecasting, government regulations, labor economics, monetary theory, urban economics and much more.

- GeoRef Preview Database - This database contains references that are being prepared for addition to the GeoRef database, one of the premier geological literature databases. Once a record has been added to GeoRef, the record is purged from this database. GeoRef Preview by Subject is divided into 17 areas of the geological sciences. Each area can be browsed. The database also supports key word searching, which includes author names. There are no abstracts in this database. Updated weekly.
- Historical Abstracts - Index to articles, dissertations, and books on the history of the world, except the United States and Canada, from 1450 to the present. Works on U.S. and Canadian history are covered in *America: History and Life*.
- Ideas (Economics) - This service uses the complete data from the RePEc database, which includes bibliographic data contributed by over 300 archives, including: EconWPA, Fed in Print, IMF, NBER, CEPR, the central banks of the US, England, Australia, Canada and other countries, and economics departments at MIT, Rochester, Northwestern, Berkeley, UCLA, Maryland, Brown, Iowa, Caltech, Boston College, Toronto, Western Ontario, LSE, Bonn, Pompeu Fabra, Tokyo, Seoul, and many others. It also covers over 200 journals, including the *American Economic Review*, *Econometrica*, *Journal of Political Economy*, *Review of Economic Studies* and *Quarterly Journal of Economics* among many others.
- Ingenta - Index to the tables of contents of 17,000 English language periodicals. Covers all disciplines. Updated daily.
- PsychInfo - Index to the professional and academic literature in psychology and related disciplines, including medicine, psychiatry, nursing, sociology, education, pharmacology, physiology, linguistics, and other areas. Coverage includes references and abstracts to over 1,300 journals in more than 20 languages, and to book chapters and books in the English language. The database includes information from empirical studies, case studies, surveys, bibliographies, literature reviews, discussion articles, conference reports and dissertations. Updated weekly.
- Spatial Odyssey - Index to the full text of GIS conference proceeding articles contributed by leading professional organizations; developed by Fogler Library and the National Center for Geographic Information and Analysis.
- Value Line Research Center - The Value Line Research Center includes on-line access to Value Line's leading publications covering stocks, mutual funds, options and convertible securities as well as special situation stocks. Online titles include: The Value Line Investment Survey, The Value Line Investment Survey – Small and Mid-Cap Edition, The Value Line Mutual Fund Survey, The Value Line Daily Options Survey, The Value Line Special Situations Service, The Value Line Convertibles Survey, and Exchange Traded Funds (ETFs). Value Line Research Center is available in Maine academic institutions. Updated daily.
- Zoological Record - Worldwide in coverage, Zoological Record indexes the complete range of zoological subjects including animal behavior, genetics, parasitology, ecology, habitat, reproduction, zoogeography, evolution, nutrition, and taxonomy. It is a comprehensive resource for taxonomy. Approximately 6,000 serial publications, a broad range of monograph titles, proceedings volumes, and reports are indexed with approximately 72,000 entries added per year. Searching is by author, title, publication source, subject, geographic location, taxonomic nomenclature. Although abstracts are not included, detailed indexing is present for each entry, with a focus on systematics. Zoological Record

searchers should rely on the detailed subject and systematic thesauri for effective searching. Updated monthly.

URSUS

- URSUS is the shared catalog of the University of Maine System, Bangor Public Library, Maine State Library, Maine State Law and Legislative Reference Library
- Students can request materials from participating libraries online through the requestor function.

Reference

- One to one walk-in reference instruction
- Scheduled group instruction sessions
- “Electronic Live Reference Service” - This service is similar to a chat session which allows a patron and librarian to talk live. Live mode is especially helpful to patrons who wish to get instruction on how to use a service and only have one telephone line. We are able to instruct the patron while he/she is still connected to the Internet.
- Email - This service allows patrons to send us their question via email. The patron will receive a reply within 24 hours (unless sent on Friday evening or on a holiday). If the patron does not receive a reply, this usually means we did not receive the email. This service is helpful to patrons when the live mode is unavailable or if the question is a more lengthy research question. A reply may only acknowledge receipt of the email. A full answer to the question may come later.

Electronic Reserves

Faculty can place articles on electronic reserves. Students can access course materials directly through Docutek or through URSUS. Courses are passworded for copyright and uploaded as pdf (portable document file) files.

NetLibrary

A collection of 7,400 e-books (3,400 copyrighted titles and 4,000 in the public domain). Although access to the public domain titles is unrestricted, users must create a personal account in order to check-out copyrighted titles and in order to access these titles from outside the recognized range of IP addresses, such as from AOL or other commercial internet service providers. The check out period is 4 hours and can be repeated.

Maine InfoNet

The Maine Info Net Statewide Catalog combines and links library collections. When the system has reached design size, a single search will scan 10,000,000 items in more than 300 libraries. A built-in requesting and transaction management system allows patrons of libraries using a qualifying online system to make online interlibrary loan requests.

With Maine InfoNet students can electronically view and request materials from a number of additional libraries through out the state. Some of these libraries include: Bates, Bowdoin, Colby, Husson, the University of New England, and Minerva a consortial online catalog of 39 public, school, college, and special libraries.
