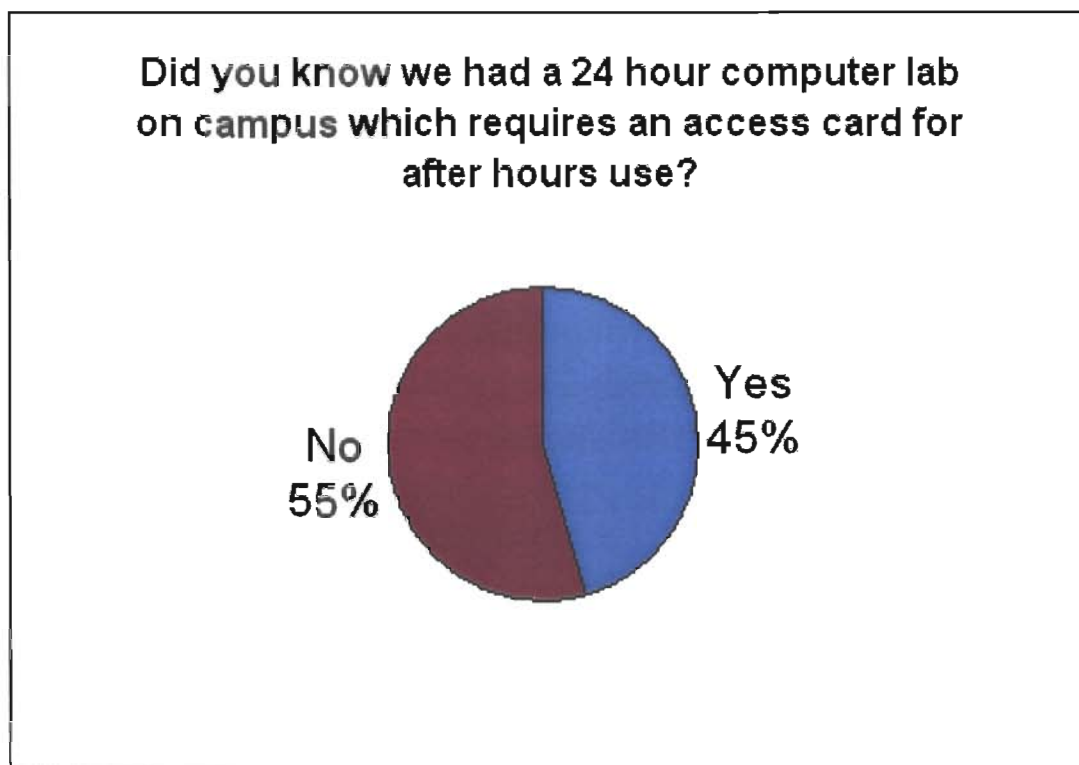


## Blake Library Poll Results

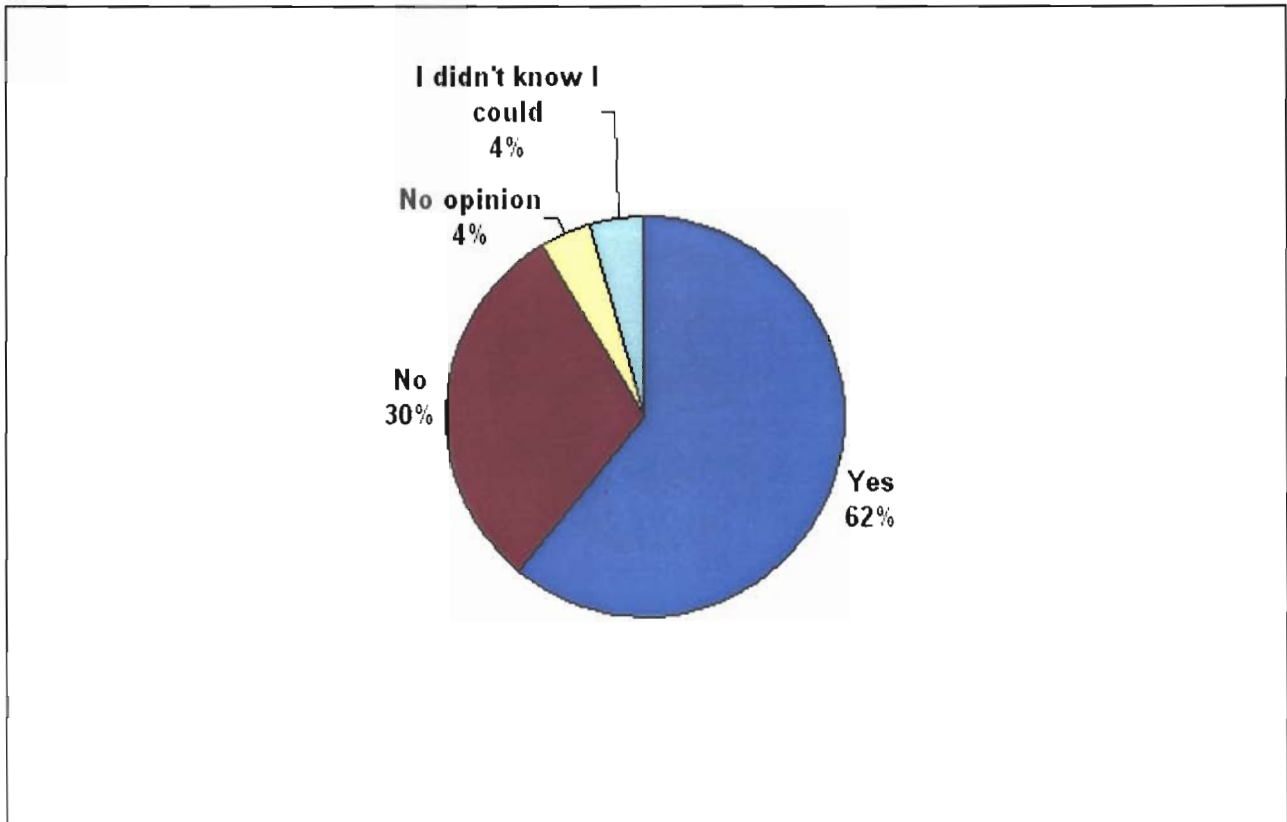
When the lab is closed there is an outside access to the lab coming from the park side of the campus. Just inside the first door there is a swipe machine where students use the card to allow them access into the lab.

Do you find requesting books from other libraries easy?

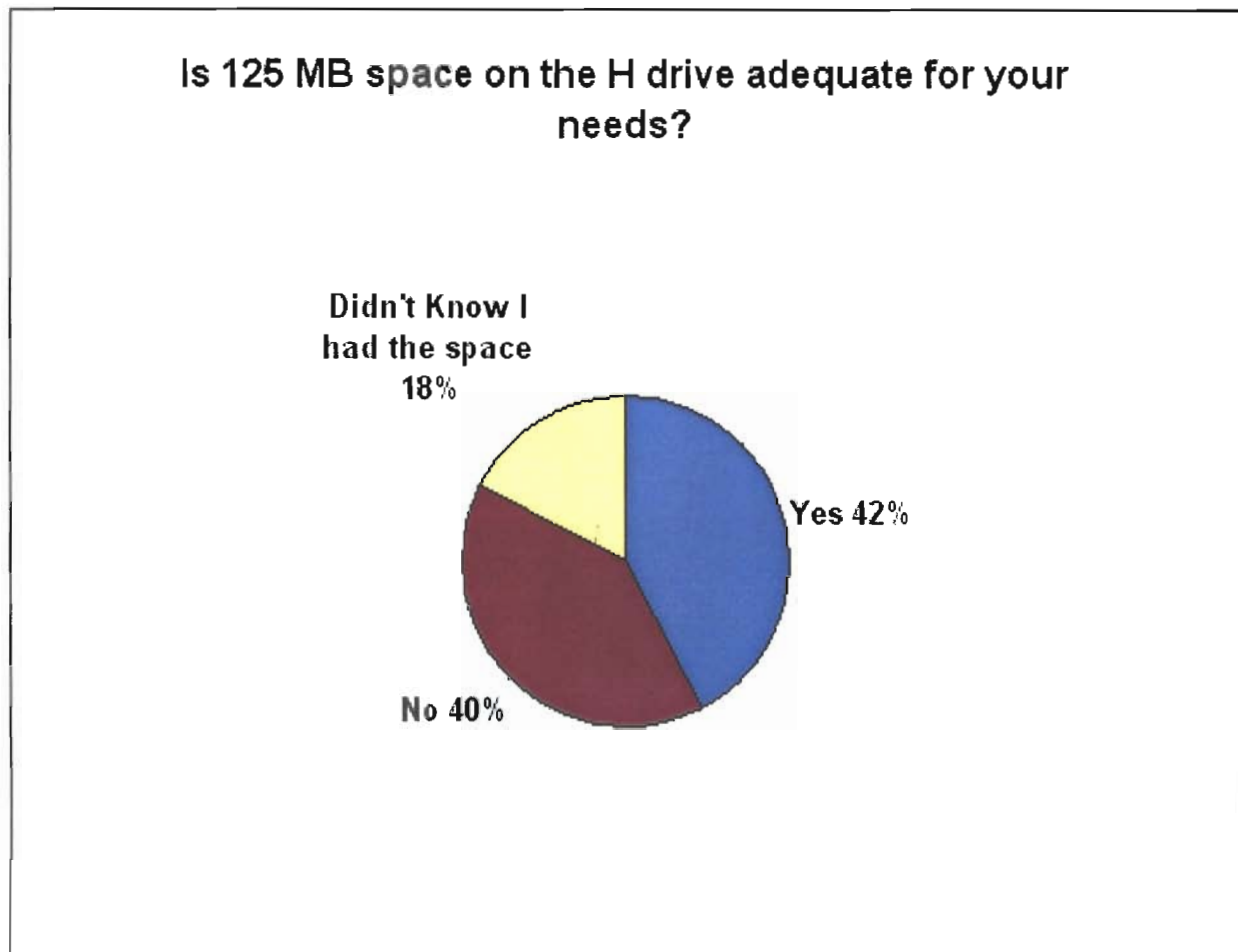


- When you find a book you want in URSUS that Blake Library does not own, you simply click on the "Request" button at the top or bottom of the URSUS screen.
- After doing so another page appears which asks you to type in your name and your barcode. The barcode is the series of numbers (no letters) on your ID card (UMFK community) or your library card (community patrons).
- You then choose Fort Kent as your pick-up location.
- Once you have entered the appropriate information, click the submit button.
- If the item you want is available at more than one location, you will need to choose a location.
- The final step is to submit one more time.
- Once you have successfully submitted your request, the item will take roughly 3-4 days to get here.
- If your request comes back saying there is a problem with your account, make sure to see the library staff as soon as possible.

All patrons of UMFK who have a computer account have space on our server located on the "H" drive (this **does not** stand for hard drive). This means where ever you go on campus and log on you will have 125 mega bytes of space to save and retrieve files. Currently you **do not** have access to this space off campus. You will still need to use a zip, floppy, or flashkey to transfer files from school to home.

Academic Computing staff are working on the ability to access the h drive from home and in the dorms as well as offering more space upon request. They estimate these new features to be available fall 2005.

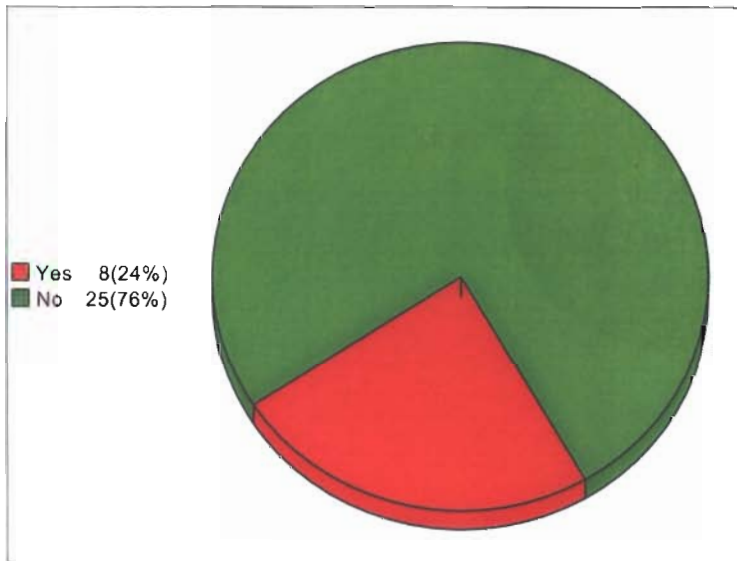

The [Archives database](#) is where you can search the "Maine Folklife Center," "Fogler Library Special Collections," and "Acadian Archives/Archives acadiennes." The archival collections catalog includes references to oral history interviews, manuscript materials, genealogical research, regional census data, business ledgers, photographs, and more. If you want to look at just the Acadian Archives/Archives acadiennes collection, you can use the keyword "MCC" once you are in the Archives database.

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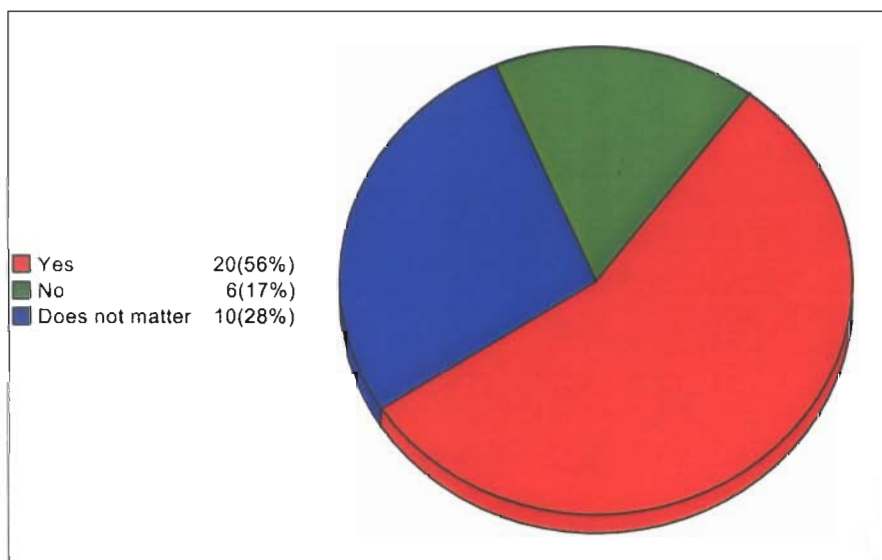

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Library staff is here to help you find the articles you need. If you find a citation to an article you want, but it is not available full text online or in our library, you can fill out an ill (interlibrary loan) form and attach the citation to the form. There is also a [form online](#) you can use. Once library staff has this form and citation we do the work of finding it and retrieving it for you.

If the article is available in the State of Maine, in most cases there will be no cost to you. If we have to go outside the state of Maine, then there may be a charge. The ill form will give you the opportunity to let us know if you are willing to pay for the article or not. We will look for it either way.

Though getting an article through ill is not as immediate as finding it online or in our library (it takes 2-5 days), it still is great to get what you want in just a short time.
