## Bibliographic and Computer Instruction

Bibliographic sessions:

- FY2009 504 students attended 34 sessions, FY2008 447 students attended 33 sessions (July-June stat). This is a difference of $13 \%$ in students and $3 \%$ in sessions.

Other instruction sessions:

- FY2008 174 students attended 9 sessions, FY2008 735 students attended 30 sessions. This is a difference of $-76 \%$ in students and $-70 \%$ in sessions.

## Indexes and Databases

- UM System sessions/logins grew $16.6 \%$ while searches grew $41.2 \%$.
- $4.6 \%$ of UMS sessions/logins and $5.0 \%$ of searches were Blake Library patrons.
- The state added GreenFILE, Lexi-PALS Drug Guide, and Teacher Reference Center.
- System database committee decided to eliminate Book Index w/Reviews, Oxford English Dictionary, and Cochran Library
- The total appropriation for system databases is $\$ 221,730$ (same as last year).
- Fort Kent sessions/logins grew $67 \%$ in use while searches grew $81 \%$.
- Fort Kent had 94 unique licensed databases in FY09 as opposed to 93 in FY08.
- New database purchases by UMFK: CINAHL with Full-Text, CJPI (criminal justice).
- BioOne: 233 full text article requests in FY2009 while there were 227 in FY2008.
- Chronicle of Higher Education: 25,924 Requests and 2,934 pages viewed from September 2008 through June 2009.

- FY2009 740 reference questions, FY2008 727 reference questions, a difference of 1.8\%.
- FY2009 963 total questions, FY2008 938 total questions, a difference of $3 \%$.
- Library attendance drops by over 14,000 or $-27 \%$ from last year.
- However library attendance via internet increases by $25 \%$ (see web report below).

## Web Report

- In FY2009, there were 52,413 off campus visitors to the site minus the spiders. In FY2008 There were 41,821 visits. This is a $25 \%$ increase.
- The top five sites visited, not including databases, URSUS, or the main page were:
- Serials by Subject (5,685 visits)
- General (4,921 visits)
- Virtual Reference (5,087 visits)
- Research Help (4,767 visits)
- Services (4,402 visits)
- The top downloaded files were:
- Annual reports 2007, book 5, appendix D (401 visits)
- Annual reports 2006, book 5, appendix D (387 visits)
- Annual reports 2006, book 5, appendix G (326 visits)
- Annual reports 2004, book 5, appendix B (314 visits)
- Tutorials DatabasesASP2_08.pdf (229 visits)
- Tuesday was the most active day of the year with Sept 18, 2008 being the most active date ( 2,519 hits - almost a thousand more than last year).
- Saturday continues to be the least active day of the year with July 31 being the least active date (158 hits - a third of last year's hits).
- The most active hour of the day was 1-2 as opposed to last year's 3-4 pm.
- The least active hour was 3-4 am as opposed to last year’s 5-6 am.
