

Serials FY2016

General statistics:

- The current serials collection consists of 149 titles
 - 94 are print only titles:
 - 53 print titles purchased through EBSCO
 - 3 of these titles were purchased through the Inez Day fund, including 1 title through a membership subscription
 - 3 of these print titles comes with other purchased print titles or membership subscriptions
 - 19 print titles purchased through non-EBSCO vendors
 - 1 of these titles was purchased through the Inez Day fund
 - 22 print titles are free/gift subscriptions (in previous years, this count may have included titles that the library receives but does not retain)
 - 19 are print + online titles:
 - 18 print + online titles purchased through EBSCO
 - 1 of these print + online titles comes with other purchased titles
 - 3 of these print + online titles was purchased through the Inez Day fund
 - 1 print + online title purchased through non-EBSCO vendor
 - 36 are online only titles (purchased individually, not through database subscriptions)
 - 33 online only titles purchased through EBSCO
 - 1 of these titles comes with another purchased title or membership subscription
 - 3 online only titles purchased through non-EBSCO vendors
- 1 new print (free/gift) title was added in FY2016 (included in the title counts above)
- FY2016, 5 serials titles were cancelled:
 - 4 print only titles purchased through EBSCO were cancelled
 - 1 of these titles came with another purchased titled that was cancelled
 - 1 online only title purchased through EBSCO was cancelled
- In FY2016, 1 print (free/gift) title ceased publication

Continuing projects and goals:

- Routing in the summer months was reinstated in FY2016, as the serials department now has a full-time staff member.
- Library staff have found that using the simpler serials checkout process instead of the more complex, slower checkout process is preferable for staff. Additionally, using the simpler process provides a much swifter and pleasant checkout experience for library patrons.
