**Organizational history:** Fraser Paper began as the Edmundston Pulp Mill in 1918. Prior to this, Archibald Fraser, the company's founder, focused on the lumber industry; it was with the 1918 mill that he moved from lumber to pulp. In 1921 the international bridge was built, linking Edmundston, New Brunswick, to Madawaska, Maine. Four years later, in 1925, the Fraser paper mill was completed.

**Scope and content:** This collection consists of a mimeograph of a typescript by Mary B. Reinmuth in collaboration with Donald A. Fraser, entitled *The Fraser Story*. Written in 1949, the 154-page manuscript relays the history of Fraser Paper, Ltd.

The typescript includes illustrations, although they are faint due to the age and style of the copy.

It is unknown whether this manuscript was ever published, though some online sources cite it as a 1953 publication (no record of the actual publication can be found).

Also included is a 3-page letter to Mr. Aubrey Crabtree pertaining to the manuscript.
