**Organizational history:** Aroostook County, Maine was incorporated on March 16, 1839. It currently consists of 2 cities, 54 towns, 11 plantations, and 108 unorganized townships, with a geographic area of 5,572 square miles, 89% of which is forest. Houlton is the county seat.

**Scope and content:** This collection consists of various materials collected and retained by Blake Library Special Collections pertaining to the cities and towns of Aroostook County. As this is an artificial collection, it may continue to grow as materials are added.
