

Welcome to a brief tutorial on getting materials from other locations.

Sometimes an article you want is not available in full text online. When this happens, you can submit an interlibrary loan (ILL) form to the library.

You can get there from the "Request Articles (ILL)" link or from within OneSearch when you find an article there.




Either way, once you are on the Interlibrary Loan site, you click on the "Interlibrary Loan Request Form" link.





Once you fill out your personal information, you select book or article and then fill out the form and submit.


You will also notice there is a place to choose a price option. Know that in most cases we will be able to get the item you want for free. However, there are some libraries that do charge a fee.



In OneSearch, you may be directed to our Interlibrary loan site where you fill in your information, or you may be asked to fill in your information from the OneSearch site especially if the item is not available.



If this later is the case, make sure to let us know if you are willing to pay or not.



If you are just starting out in college, you should not need to pay for articles.


