
Welcome to a quick tutorial on understanding Peer reviewed material and how to get it.

In OneSearch, the "Peer-Reviewed" filter is located on the left hand side of the page under refine search.



When you select peer-review, you are limiting your resources to materials that have the following qualities.

Will have one or more authors who are experts in the subject matter of the article you chose.


